# **LUMC International Discovery Scholarship (Short Term Stay) Regulations**

# Article 1: Objective

1.1 The scholarship is exclusively available to students enrolled at Leiden University in at least one of the academic bachelor's or master's programs of LUMC.

# Article 2: Eligibility Criteria

- 2.1 The scholarship is only awarded to students who have successfully completed the mandatory components of the first-year (propedeutic) phase as stipulated in the applicable Education and Examination Regulations.
- 2.2 If the Erasmus+ scholarship can be applied for, the International Discovery Scholarship (Short Term Stay) cannot be requested.
- 2.3 The duration of the international activity must **not** exceed one month.
- 2.4 The activity must take place at a location within Europe.
- 2.5 The activity must be hybrid or conducted on-site, with the physical component taking place outside the Netherlands.
- 2.6 The activity must be relevant to the student's study program; however, earning ECTS credits is not a requirement for participation or completion.

#### Article 3: Application and Award Process

- 3.1 All scholarships are awarded based on eligibility criteria and available budget.
- 3.2 Applications must be submitted through the designated digital application form.
- 3.3 Scholarships are awarded by means of a lottery.
- 3.4 There are multiple application deadlines. The deadlines and corresponding activity periods are as follows:

Application deadline	Activity takes place in period
April 1	June, July, August
July 1	September, October, November
October 1	December, January, February
January 1	March, April, May

3.5 A scholarship may be applied for multiple times during a student's academic career and can be awarded once during the bachelor's program and once during the master's program.

- 3.6 Students applying for the first time will be given priority in the lottery over students who have previously received the scholarship.
- 3.7 The scholarship amount is €150.
- 3.8 Applications will be assessed based on the eligibility criteria outlined in Article 2.
- 3.9 The student will be informed of the decision regarding their application within 10 working days after the nearest application deadline (as stated in Article 3.3).

#### **Article 4: Cancellation and Appeals**

- 4.1 The student must fully reimburse the scholarship if they do not proceed with the international experience.
- 4.2 Appeals regarding decisions related to the processing of awarded scholarships can be submitted digitally to the International Office of the Directorate of Education and Training (<a href="mailto:intoff@lumc.nl">intoff@lumc.nl</a>) for a decision by the dean. The procedure is as follows:
  - If a student disagrees with a written decision regarding the final scholarship determination, they may submit an appeal to the dean of LUMC.
  - The appeal must be submitted digitally to the International Office (<a href="mailto:intoff@lumc.nl">intoff@lumc.nl</a>) within 30 working days from the date of the decision.
  - The appeal must include:
    - The name and address of the appellant;
    - The date and signature;
    - The grounds for the appeal and justification;
    - A description of the decision being appealed, with a copy of the decision attached.
  - If the appeal is submitted on time and is complete, the student will receive a confirmation of receipt. A substantive response to the appeal will be provided within 30 working days.
  - If the appeal is not submitted within the deadline, it will not be processed.

### Article 5: Publication

The regulations are established by the dean and published on the university website.

## Article 6: Effective Date

These regulations will take effect on January 1, 2025.
